What Is OCA?

Ongoing Child Assessment is the process of gathering, documenting, tracking, and using information over time about your child's growth and development.

What is the Purpose of OCA?

- Helps to plan the best interventions for your child and see how well they are working
- Helps to individualize learning strategies based on your child's interests
- Allows us to celebrate your child's progress and stay up-to-date with their development

What Does OCA Look Like?

- Together, we'll **observe** your child in various familiar settings and activities to understand their abilities and interests.
- Together, we'll talk about what you see your child doing in everyday life; in your home and community.
- We'll use a tool to guide the assessment and document your child's development and progress in a variety of ways.
- Based on the assessment, together we'll plan the activities and strategies that will support your child's growth and development.

What is Your Role in OCA?

- Share what you see your child doing at home and in the community. You know your child best!
- **Explore** together how everyday activities can be learning opportunities.
- Communicate activities and strategies that work (and don't work) for you and your child.
- Tell us what you are concerned about or need support with.
- **Stay engaged** by participating in visits, asking questions, and creating joint plans to practice when we aren't with you.
